The information in this document is based on our review of national dementia strategies available on the Alzheimer’s Disease International (ADI) website as of June 20, 2017. ADI uses the word “plan” to refer to dementia policies created by government, and “strategy” to refer to documents generated by non-governmental groups; however, we have decided to use the word “strategy” to refer to government dementia policies. This aligns with the dominant language used in Canada, including the *National Strategy for Alzheimer’s Disease and Dementias Act*, the new legislation which calls for the federal government to develop and implement a national dementia strategy.

We used the following search terms: criminal justice; criminal law; justice [criminal, not civil]; crime [accused, not victim]; offender; jail; prisoner; and medico-legal or medicolegal [if in relation to criminal justice].
